



Temporary Political Signs

No Sign Permit Required for Political Signs. Political signs do not require a sign permit, shall not be counted towards the amount or type of signage otherwise allowed by the Sign Code Chapter, and may be displayed only in compliance with the following standards.

No political sign shall be internally illuminated or be illuminated by an external light source primarily intended for the illumination of the political sign.

A political sign shall be attached to a site or constructed in a manner that both prevents the sign from being easily removed by unauthorized persons or being blown from its location, and allows for the easy removal of the sign by authorized persons. Political signs shall not be attached to trees, shrubbery, utility poles or traffic control signs or devices.

No political sign shall be erected or maintained that, by reason of its size, location or construction, constitutes a hazard to the public.

Political signs are allowed in Residential Zones and Agricultural Zone (R-1, R-1.5, R-2, A). One or more political signs no taller than 4 feet in height, and not exceeding 6 square feet in area each, may be displayed on a lot during the period from 120 days before a public election or the time the election is called, whichever is earlier, to five days after the public election.

Political signs are allowed in Commercial and Industrial Zones (C-R, C-1, C-2, C-C, C-M, M-1, M-2). One or more political signs no taller than 5 feet in height, and not exceeding 4 square feet in area each, may be displayed on a lot during the period from 120 days before a public election or the time the election is called, whichever is earlier, to five days after the public election.
